THE CODE...

- The Code of Student Conduct is administered through the Office of Judicial Affairs.
- Rights of students and the standard of conduct (academic and non-academic) .
- Each incoming new student will receive *The Code* in the Student Handbook and Planner at Welcome Week registration

Members of the University Community

Responsibility of Members

- KNOW YOUR RIGHTS
- DO NOT participate in prohibited conduct
- Adhere to the process



Highlights of *The Code*

- Standards of Academic and Non-Academic conduct and the processes are outlined in *The Code*
- If you are arrested, you must notify the Office of Judicial Affairs within 72 hours
- Prohibited conduct off campus is still subject to *The Code*
- Minimum sanctions for students found in violation of alcohol and drug conduct

Highlights of *The Code*

- Alcohol and drug prohibited conduct includes, but is not limited to:
 - Possession,
 - Sale,
 - Distribution,
 - In presence of
- The standard of evidence is based on a majority of the evidence
- Residence Life staff members are judicial officers as well as the staff of Judicial Affairs
