What does an English major study?

Students who complete the requirements for a degree in English will be able to demonstrate:

- An ability to write essays, both formal and informal, that reflect a proficient use of academic research skills and rhetorical conventions.
- An ability to read and analyze, both orally and in writing, texts from the four major literary genres fiction, poetry, drama, and creative non-fiction.
- Knowledge of the cultural or historical context of major literary texts.
- An understanding of the characteristics of the linguistic system and the historic development of language.
- A mastery of advanced reading, writing, analytical and interpretive techniques suitable for a variety of academic, creative and professional settings.

Why study English at Coastal Carolina?

- Students may craft a program of study, with a focus on literature, creative writing, professional writing, or a combination of these
- Students may earn course credit for internships at sites including local newspapers and magazines, television stations, radio stations and non-profit organizations.
- Study abroad opportunities are available through exchange agreements and through Maymester and summer travel courses.
- Undergraduate research opportunities with English faculty serving as mentors and advisors are available. Students may work collaboratively with faculty mentors to develop presentations for a variety of University, state, regional, national and international conferences.
