“Prague... is amazing. It is so old and beautiful that I want to live here. For dinner we got ‘Pizza Go Home’ (takeout pizza), but it was not as delicious as expected. We went to a Czech restaurant Dr. Damonte found that was the best food that I have had in Europe. I also could not believe the quality of food and restaurant atmosphere that we could get for such low prices.”

“The International Gypsy Festival was really cool. We went downstairs and started to dance. I enjoyed the music and the whole atmosphere. It also helped shatter some stereotypes that I had of Roma people.... I saw they were rich in culture and customs.”
