1. ALL freshmen take career assessment inventories and spend approximately two weeks in career exploration exercises during their First-Year Experience course.
2. All freshmen are given the tools to understand their career objectives based on their interests, abilities and values. They are encouraged to set goals early so they can choose the right major for themselves and gain the correct experience needed for their chosen profession.
3. A second three semester hour Career Exploration class (University 150) is offered for students still struggling with a career decision.
4. Students are given the opportunity to job-shadow in order to solidify their career goals.
5. Internships are available for juniors and seniors through the Career Services internship network.
6. Resumé development, job-search strategies, interviewing skills and networking are taught to individuals and groups through workshop settings.
7. Students are assisted in developing a job-search plan and applying to potential employers.
