

## At a Glance - University of Exeter Exchange Program

Location: Three main campuses – two in Exeter and one at Tremough, near Falmouth in Cornwall. The city of Exeter, only a 15-minute walk away from the main campus, has a population of 115,000.

Student Population: 13,500 of whom 10,000 are undergraduates

Tuition fees and Living Costs: \$3,800.00 (2007-2008 In-State Tuition Rate)

Accommodations Cost: In the year beginning October 2006 the cost of self-catering accommodation was £60.34-£95.69 per week depending on the type of room. Self-catering accommodation is normally let for either 39 weeks (term-time and the Christmas and Easter vacations) or 34 weeks (excluding the Easter vacation). However, if you are in Exeter for less than a full year we can usually offer you a place, but this is not guaranteed. Letting periods are currently under review and will be confirmed in the Accommodation Brochure for 2007/08.

Qualifications: minimum GPA of 3.0 will be required for admission

Courses Taught in English: All Subjects

Accommodations: University Flats

We have nearly 2,000 places in purpose-built flats. All rooms are single and again we offer different types of room. **Standard rooms** have a washbasin in the room with up to 12 students sharing the bathrooms/showers, kitchen and lounge facilities. **Enhanced rooms** benefit from improved communal facilities and **en-suite rooms** have a shower, washbasin and toilet in the room with up to eight students sharing the other facilities. All study bedrooms in our purpose-built flats are furnished with a bed, wardrobe, bookshelves, desk and chair, desk lamp or built-in lighting, and a notice board and have a phone and high speed network/internet link. The kitchens are modern and well-equipped and the communal areas have coffee tables, easy chairs and a TV. We have a number of en-suite rooms at ground level which are suitable for students with a range of disabilities. Please discuss your personal needs with the Accommodation Office who will be happy to make the necessary arrangements. Full details are given in the Accommodation Brochure.
