

At a Glance - Ecole Superieure du Commerce Exterieur (ESCE)

Location: Paris-La Defense, France. Leonard de Vinci University Campus.

Student Population: 1,300 French and approximately 300 foreign students mainly in the four-year undergraduate program

Tuition fees and Living Costs: \$3,800.00 (2007 CCU In-State Tuition Rate)

Accommodations Cost: On-campus housing – Pythagore Grande Arche Residence Halls

Furnished studio of approximately 18 to 20 square meters. Room amenities include: single bed (bed linens not provided), an internet connection outlet, a telephone, a kitchenette (2 hot plates, a microwave, a small fridge, a sink, plates, cutlery, pots and pans); an attached full bathroom (towels provided). A grocery store called “Monoprix” is about a three-minute walk from the Residence Building. The store is open everyday until 8PM except on Sundays. Washing machines and dryers are available for the residents at the ground floor of the building. A vacuum cleaning is available for a charge per hour. Self-catering accommodation is 610Euros per month all included EXCEPT electricity and telephone. Guarantee deposit of 2 months’ rent, refunded at the end of the rental agreement if the studio is in the same condition as upon arrival. Reservation fee of 350 Euro to be paid at the latest two months before arrival (non-refundable). Once your housing application is received, the Residence will contact you directly with a housing proposal. You have 10 days to pay the Reservation fee.

Qualifications: minimum GPA of 3.0 will be required for admission
