## **“Leadership as Morality Magnified”**

Internationally acclaimed business ethicist Dr. Joanne Ciulla will discuss some of the ethical challenges that are unique to people in leadership positions, such as the difficulties of responsibly managing power and exercising self-control. Leaders are also charged with moral obligations to people they do not know, and sometimes to people they do not like. They must possess vivid moral imaginations that allow them to think systematically about their actions both in terms of precedent setting and in terms of potential for unintended consequences. Both the scope and the impact of a leader's moral actions illustrate Ciulla's assertion that leadership is morality magnified.
