REALISTIC

People who have athletic or mechanical ability, prefer to work with objects, machines, tools, plants or animals, or to be outdoors. Preference for working with things as opposed to ideas or people. Prefer concrete problems over abstract problems. Action focused. CAREERS: Engineer, Park Ranger, Marine Scientist, Athletic Trainer, Zoologist, Police Officer, Veterinarian, Pilot, Recreation Aide

INVESTIGATIVE

People who like to observe, learn, investigate, analyze, evaluate, or solve problems primarily of a scientific or mathematical nature. Prefer working with ideas as opposed to people. Do not like highly structured settings.

CAREERS: Doctor, Psychologist, Researcher, Marine Biologist, Systems Analyst, Mathematician, Intelligence Analyst, Programmer, Data Analyst, Investigator, Actuary

ARTISTIC

People who have artistic, innovating, or intuitional abilities, and like to work in unstructured situations, using their creativity or imagination. Prefer working with self-expressive ideas.

CAREERS: Journalist, Digital Creator, Music Director, Public Relations, Librarian, Advertising Exec, Graphic Designer, Marketing, Writer/Editor, Museum Curator, Translator, Teacher, Event Planner

SOCIAL

People who like to work with people – to inform, enlighten, help, train, or cure them, or to help them live up to their potential. Prefer solving problems through discussion. Enjoy helping others.

CAREERS: Counselor, Advocate, Teacher, Social Worker, Trainer, Speech Pathologist, Human Resources, Health Educator, Therapist, Advisor, Community

ENTERPRISING

People who like to work with people – managing, influencing, persuading, or leading them for economic gain or for the goals of an organization. Enjoy leadership positions and dislike details.

CAREERS: Realtor, Political Analyst, Financial Advisor, Sales Representative, Manager, Human Resources, Recruiter, Educational Administrator, Event Planner, Lawyer, Marketing Coordinator

CONVENTIONAL

People who like to work with data, have numerical or clerical ability, carrying things out in detail for following through on other's instruction. Prefer structured situations over ambiguous ones.

CAREERS: Accountant, Patient Representative, Paralegal, Actuary, Tech Support, Insurance Adjuster, Statistician, Librarian, Administrative Assistant, Data specialist, Loan Processor
