Assessment Institute: Introduction to Assessment

This introduction session will review the program we have developed based on the University Wide Assessment Committee for Student Learning Outcomes suggestions. This program is specially designed to meet the needs of those who want to know more about how to do assessment, such as college-wide assessment coordinators and department chairs who are overseeing programs and are interested in improving their programs. Faculty who are interested in classroom research may also find this program of interest.

Assessment Institute: First Steps

In this session, we discuss the relationship of course assessments to program assessments, student learning outcomes, classroom assessment techniques (CATS) (Angelo & Cross, 2001) and designing an assessment plan. Examples are shown of how CATS can be used for quick assessments to generate meaningful data.

Assessment Institute: Connecting Classroom Assessment to Program Evaluation

We will discuss the pros and cons of various assessments, assessment options to meet your specific needs and how your assessment data meets the needs of TealOnline. In addition, we will discuss assessment plans for your courses and/or programs and revisions you have made based on knowledge gained in the Assessment Institute courses.

Assessment Institute: Conclusion

We will discuss "continuous improvement:" what it means, how you write it up, how it impacts the assessment cycle.
