(2) Students must take a foreign language placement test. The results will require either 6 hours of a foreign language in sequence or 3 hours of a foreign language at the 130 level or higher.
(3) Choose from BIOL 122/L, CHEM 150/L, COMM 140, CSCI 101, CSCI 130, ENGL 102, ENGL 211, ENGL 290, ENGR 101, HIST 250, MSCI 201, PHIL 271, POLI 200, PSYC 202, THEA 149, or SOC 201
(4) Choose from ARTH 105, ARTH 106, ARTH 107, ARTS 102, ENGL 201, MUS 110, MUS 257, MUS 258, THEA 101 or THEA 201
(5) Choose course from two of the four fields of study (ENGL 205, ENGL 287, ENGL 288), (HIST 101, HIST 102, HIST 202), (PHIL 101 or PHIL 102). (THEA 130)
(6) Choose from ECON 110, HPRO 121, EXSS 122, RSM 120, PSYC 101, SOC 101, or WGST 103
(7) Completion of approved study-abroad course, OR choose 1 from ANTH 102, CBAD 120, ECON 150, ENGL 275, ENGL 276, ENGL 277, GEOG 121, HIST 111, HIST 112, POLI 101 or RELG 103
(8) Select from any 300 or 400 level Economics Course
