Academy Award-nominee Gérard Depardieu stars in this heart-warming story of Germain, middle-aged and barely literate after an incomplete education, who faces constant ridicule from his friends at the local bistro. His life takes a turn for the better when he meets Margueritte, a 95-year-old woman with a passion for reading. She introduces him to the magic of literature and imparts to him the gift of knowledge along with a much-needed boost of self-confidence. Won Audience Award at Newport Beach Film Festival. Rated PG.

Baya’s father is from Algeria, her mother from France; his mother is a Jew. She is a free spirit; he is a complete square. She is provocative; he is discreet. She does not hesitate to use sex to turn conservatives into liberals; he is a one-woman man. Bahia (Sara Forestier) and forensic veterinarian Arthur (Jacques Gamblin) are as different as people can be. So when they fall in love, sparks fly. Mixed with the love story between opposites are concerns about names and cultural identities and how when two people fall in love, they bring not just their histories but the histories of their families and the cultures and nations that molded them.
