

# **Request for Deferred Admission**

# Instructions:

To request a deferral of your admission to Coastal Carolina University, please complete and send the Request for Deferred Admission Form to the address below. You may email, mail or fax the form.

If you have not already done so, you must submit the non-refundable \$100 enrollment fee with your request.

# **Deferred Admission Guidelines:**

- Deferred admission may only be granted for up to one year (two regular semesters) to admitted students who have paid the required non-refundable \$100 enrollment fee. Students may be considered for a two-year deferral (four regular semesters) for military service and for service/mission experience.
- 2. Students will only be granted a deferral to attend a regionally accredited two-year college. Students who plan to attend a two-year institution will be subject to meeting the transfer eligibility requirements of earning a cumulative 2.0 GPA with a minimum of 12 credit hours if deferring for one semester and 24 credit hours if deferring for one academic year. A deferment will not be granted for students enrolling at a four-year institution.
- 3. Deferred freshmen must submit a final high school transcript. Deferred transfer students must submit a final, official college transcript from all colleges/universities attended.
- 4. Students who are approved for deferred admission will be subject to requirements outlined in the <u>Academic Catalog</u> for the term in which they are approved to enroll.
- 5. Deferred students must complete a new Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the academic year in which they wish to enroll.
- 6. Students who are approved for deferred admission will be sent a letter confirming admission for the new term. Readmission will be dependent on satisfactory completion of the Request for Deferred Admission Form and the updated non-academic review information.
- 7. The Office of Admissions and Merit Awards reserves the right to ask for additional information and the right to deny the request for deferral. If the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards denies the request for deferred admission, then the \$100 enrollment fee will be refunded.

# **Deferred Admission Request Deadline:**

To consider your request to defer your admission, the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards must receive this completed request form and you must pay the required \$100 enrollment deposit by 5 p.m. on the first day of classes for the semester admitted. Those dates are listed on the website and on the <u>academic calendar</u>.

# Section 2: Personal Statement

Deferrals may be granted for the purpose of work, travel, military service, service/mission work, or the pursuit of a special talent. Students may also be granted a deferral for extenuating financial or personal reasons. Students are permitted to enroll at a regionally accredited 2-year college/university only. Students are not permitted to defer to attend a 4-year institution. Please tell us your plans for the deferred period. Please include all relevant dates.

### Section 3: Non-Academic Admissions Review

All applicants are required to respond to a series of non-academic admissions review questions on the application for admission. Responses to these questions are initially reviewed by the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards. Some cases are referred through the non-academic admissions review process for further consideration. An applicant must be approved by the non-academic admissions review process prior to being considered for admission. This non-academic admissions review process supports the University's goal of maintaining a safe learning community. Failure to submit complete responses and/or falsification of responses may result in revocation of the admission decision or dismissal if the student presents false information or an incomplete response is discovered after enrollment. Any incident resulting in any change to these questions subsequent to the application must be immediately reported in writing by the applicant to the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards. Failure to do so may result in the revocation of the admissions decision are not allowed to enroll in classes or participate in campus activities. Failure to disclose registration at any time shall result in immediate dismissal.

If you answer "yes" to any question below, additional documentation will likely be requested from you to complete your deferred admissions application. You will receive a separate request in writing from the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards if we require additional documentation.
