



Visit https://typefocus7.com/userLogin then create an account using your CCU email and type in the Type Focus 7 access code: 3FD2GC88






Step 2.1: once you have completed the assessments begin exploring and save the occupations that interest you. Also, save the CCU majors/programs that support these occupations.




Step 2.2: You have the option to filter your results based on education needed:


