

### CAEP Annual Reporting Measure 5: Graduation Rates

Undergraduate program graduation rates range from 35.7% to 53.3% within six years of enrollment among EPP initial licensure programs in the year of 2019-2020. (See Table 1.) Reviewing the past three years shows Early Childhood Education and Elementary Education programs have increased their graduation rates. Middle-level Education, Physical Education, and Special Education programs show a decrease in their graduation rates. The Graduate initial program (MAT Secondary Education) displays its graduation rate of more than 80% within two years of enrollment in the past three years. See Table 2.

The advanced program, Educational Leadership (M.Ed.), shows a consistent increase in its graduation rate. The Educational Leadership (Ed.S.) program's graduation rate is 50%, which is lower than the year 2017-2018 and 2018-2019. See Table 2.
