APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The December 2, 2020 minutes were approved by unanimous consent.

CONSENT AGENDA: The February 3, 2021 consent agenda was approved by unanimous consent.

PRESIDENT, PROVOST AND OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:

President Benson:

• President Benson welcomed everyone to join the next Empowered University which will be held on February 26, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. This session will be moderated by Dr. Tia Stokes-Brown.

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- The University has just received final state approvals for the Kimbel Library renovation and construction of the Library Learning Complex. The Library Learning Complex is slated for an August 2023 completion.
- There will be two outdoor graduation ceremonies this coming May. They will be held on May 7th and May 8th.

Provost Ennis:

- Provost Ennis shared an admission's report on retention. First-semester retention, to date, of the fall 2020 freshman class is 89.4% This is up from the previous year, which was 89.1%.
- Freshmen applications are up 4.2% for fall 2021. Freshmen deposits are down 36.7%. Provost Ennis credits these number with the University's move to Common App. With this new application program, the University increases its applications, but is down in yield.
- Fall 2021 will be modeled after the fall 2019 schedule. Classes will be primarily face-to-face with normal caps.

Lee Carter, Director of Wellness Outreach, LiveWell Office:

- The QPR Initiative is a new training coming out of the LiveWell Office. QPR stands for Question, Persuade and Refer. This is a suicide prevention training. This training gives faculty and staff tools for what to do or say if a student is struggling with thoughts of self-harm or suicide. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many students are battling with mental health issues.
- The QPR training is in Moodle and takes about an hour. There are some employees on campus that may be required to take the training.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Brian Bunton, Chair, reported the following:

- Approval of undergraduate administrative actions 10-12 and graduate administrative actions 2-3 from the December 2, 2020 meeting.
- There are ten policies that are up for review. These are forthcoming to future Senate meetings for a vote.
- Sharon Tutrone, Lecturer in Communication, Media and Culture, has been nominated to the new committee that reviews proposals for the Chanticleer Store
- The Faculty Senate Chair report was given via writing in the December Board of Trustees meeting. It is also located on the Faculty Senate website for viewing.
- The previously scheduled Q&A with President Benson has been postponed and a new date is currently being worked on.
- Faculty Senate Executive Committee elections are this coming May.
