Abstract

Notice the abstract is not indented. It is a concise presentation of your entire paper. It should include the findings (if a study is being conducted). It should also address the major issues/points in the research and discuss possible future research. It should be between 150-250 words total. It should be a single paragraph, double-spaced. Notice the keywords section below. It is indented and italicized. Also, it should include a few words and/or phrases that relate to the paper. These are sometimes referred to as “tags.”

Keywords: APA, format, English

Level 1 heading: Centered, Bold.

Level 2 heading: Unindented, bold (Levels 1 & 2 capitalize each word in the title).

Text begins below the level 2 heading, indented.

Level 3 heading: Indented, bold. Just capitalize the first word and end with a period.

For a level 3 heading, the text begins on the same line as the title, and begins right after the period.

Level 4 heading: Indented, bold, italicized. Just capitalize the first word and end with a period. For a level 3 heading, the text begins on the same line as the title, and begins right after the period.

Level 5 heading: Indented, unbold, italicized. Just capitalize the first word and end with a period. For a level 3 heading, the text begins on the same line as the title, and begins right after the period.
