ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book, 2007

Enrollment – Fall 2007

- Total enrollment is 7,872. This is a decrease of 177 (2.1%) from the previous fall semester. The 2.1% decrease occurs as a result of intentional downsizing of instruction offered to part-time non-degree seeking graduate students taught as part of Coastal's contract education courses. Fall 2007 FTE increased by 3% to 7,177 during the same period. This period saw the second largest number of enrolled of students at Coastal since 2002.
- Total undergraduate enrollment is 7,070, which is an increase of 410 (6.2%) students from the previous fall semester and the largest undergraduate enrollment since fall 2002.
- Undergraduate degree and non-degree seeking undergraduate students made up 90% of total fall 2007 enrollment, while 10% of the total fall 2007 enrollment was graduate degree and non-degree seeking graduate students. The graduate degree seeking population continues to grow with an increase of 87% since fall 2003 and14% since fall 2006. This growth can be attributed to the establishment of growing graduate programs in Business, Education, and Science.
- Since 1994, the number of students attending May, Summer I, and Summer II semesters has grown, along with the number of hours. Overall, the number of students enrolled in the summer semesters has slightly increased but the number of hours taken during the summer semesters have decreased. Summer I continues to be the most "popular" semester for student attendance. Summer enrollment during 2007 was 3,382 and 12,733 hours.
- Total FTE for Fall 2007 is 7,177, an increase of 233 FTE (3.4%) from the previous fall and the highest in the history of Coastal Carolina University.

Demographics – Fall 2007

- Women made up 56% of the total Fall 2007 enrollment, and 83% of students were enrolled full-time in Fall 2007.
- Fifty-six (56%) of total student enrollment is from the State of South Carolina, with the remaining students from out-of-state or international origins. The most numerous out-of-state students enrolled at Coastal from the states of New Jersey (6.2%), New York (6.1%), and Maryland (5.4%). International student enrollment accounted for ninety-eight students (1.2%) with a majority from Germany (0.2%).
- In fall 2007, students enrolled at Coastal Carolina from all counties in South Carolina. Students from Horry county represented the largest number of enrollees at 1,933 (24.5%) followed by Richland (4.0%), Lexington (4.0%) and Georgetown (3.3%).
- The most prominent ethnic group represented at Coastal was White, non-Hispanic, with 82% of the total Fall 2007 enrollment. The second largest ethnic group was African American, non Hispanic, with 12% of the total fall 2007 enrollment.







FIRST-TIME STUDENTS HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book, 2007

Enrollment and academic trends for first-time students show the following.

- In 2007, 38.7% of new freshman and transfer students attended Summer Orientation sessions, and 41.4% of accepted students who attended these sessions enrolled at Coastal Carolina University.
- Applications from new undergraduate students increased by 36% between Fall 2003 and Fall 2007. New students who were accepted to the University increased 30% between Fall 2003 and Fall 2007. New students who enrolled increased by 11% between Fall 2003 and Fall 2007. In Fall 2007, 42% of accepted applicants enrolled at Coastal Carolina University.
- Between fall 2003 and fall 2007, the average SAT score among Coastal freshman decreased by 6 points yet still exceeded the average scores for high school students in South Carolina and the nation (the writing test is not included in total SAT scores). The average ACT composite score for Coastal freshman was on par with that of the nation and one point higher than the state-wide average for the Fall 2007 cohort.
- The average high school GPA for Coastal freshman increased, from 3.27 for the Fall 2003 cohort to 3.32 for the Fall 2007 cohort. The Fall 2007 cohort GPA is consistent with the previously admitted Fall 2006 cohort at 3.32.
- The freshman profile for the Fall 2003 through Fall 2007 cohorts indicates that the number of first-time students that apply, are accepted, and enroll at Coastal Carolina University continues to grow. In fall 2007, there were 1,652 new freshman, an increase of 12%, from fall 2006.
- There were a total of 1,468 First-Time, Full-Time students enrolled at Coastal between Fall 2006 and Fall 2007. Among First-Time Full-Time Students, between Fall 2006 and Fall 2007, there were approximately 1044 (71.1%) students continuing their studies at Coastal Carolina University. In geographic origin, 441 (42.2%) of continuing students were native to South Carolina and 603 (57.8%) consisted of students from other U.S. states and international students. Among the academic colleges, the continuation of Full-Time First-Time Students, for this period, is as follows: Wall College of Business Administration (73.8%), College of Education (63.7%), College of Humanities and Fine Arts (74.7%), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences (72.2%) and undeclared majors (70.0%).


Demographics - First-Time Full-Time Freshman - Fall 2007

- The most prominent ethnic group among the Fall 2007 First-Time Full-Time Freshmen were Caucasians (82.8%) with African Americans consisting of 12.0% and Hispanics encompassing 2.4% of this group.
- Females slightly outnumbered males in the Fall 2007 Full-Time First-Time Freshman group making up 53.7% of the total.

- First-Time Full-Time Freshman, during this period, consisted mostly of students under the age of 20 at 98.7%.
- Among the Full-Time First-Time Freshman, during Fall 2007, there were more out-of-state students enrolled (52.8%) than in-state students (46.8%) and international students consisted of 0.4%.
- Twenty-two percent (22.0%) of the in-state First-Time Full-Time Freshman at Coastal originated from the immediate Five-County Service Area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately twenty-five (24.9%) originated from other South Carolina counties.
- Approximately seventy-two percent (72.3%) of First-Time Full-Time Freshman during Fall 2007 reported high school grade point averages (GPA) equal or exceeding 3.00. Thirty-two percent (32.4%) indicated a high school GPA that fell between 3.00 and 3.49, while approximately forty percent (39.9%) reported a GPA of 3.50 or higher.
- For the Full-Time, First-Time Freshman during Fall 2007, approximately fourteen percent (13.9%) had not declared a major and some of the most popular undergraduate majors at Coastal Carolina among these students included: Marine Science (11.3%), Management (10.9%), and Biology (9.9%).

FIRST-TIME TRANSFER STUDENTS HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book, 2007

Enrollment and academic trends of first-time transfer students show the following.

- The number of students who transferred to Coastal Carolina in 2006 increased by 4% since 2005. Transfer students who came to Coastal from other South Carolina higher education institutions comprised approximately 41% of the total transfer student population in 2006. The majority of these in-state transfer students (approximately 50%) having enrolled from Horry-Georgetown Technical College.
- The first year student retention rate for 2006 transfer students was 71.7%, the highest since 2002.
- There were a total of 583 First-Time Full-Time Transfer students enrolled at Coastal between Fall 2006 and Fall 2007. Among this group, there were approximately 410 (70.3%) students continuing their studies at Coastal Carolina University. In geographic origin, 209 (51.0%) of continuing students were native to South Carolina and 201 (49.0%) consisted of students from other U.S. states or countries. Among the academic colleges, the continuation of First-Time Full-Time Transfer students, for this period, is as follows: Wall College of Business Administration (68.2%), College of Education (72.9%), College of Humanities and Fine Arts (69.3%), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences (70.7%) and undeclared majors (80.0%).

<u>Demographics - First-Time Full-Time Transfers - Fall 2007</u>

- The most prominent ethnic group among the Fall 2007 First-Time Full-Time
 Transfers were Caucasians (81.7%) with African Americans consisting of 9.7%,
 Asian/Pacific Islanders at 2.1% and Hispanics encompassing 1.5% of this group.
 Non-Resident Aliens comprised 2.8% of the Fall 2006 First-Time Full-Time
 Transfer students at Coastal.
- The number of males and female First-Time Full-Time Transfers to Coastal Carolina University were nearly equal with males out numbering females by one, and consisting of 50.1% of the group.
- First-Time Full-Time Transfers, during this period, consisted mostly of students between the ages of 20 and 22, which was 59.2% of this group and an additional 20.6% consisted of students less than 20 years of age.
- Among the Full-Time First-Time Transfers, during Fall 2007, there were more instate students enrolled (50.2%) than out-of-state students (47.0%) and international students consisted of 2.8% of this group.
- In Fall 2007, approximately thirty-three percent (32.7%) of the in-state First-Time Full-Time Transfer students at Coastal originated from the immediate Five-County Service Area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately eighteen percent (17.5%) originated from other South Carolina counties.

- Of the 611 First-Time Full-Time Transfers to Coastal Carolina, sixty-eight percent (68.1%) transferred more than thirty credit hours, three percent (3.3%) transferred with 30 hours, and a hundred and seventy five (28.6%) transferred to Coastal with less than 30 hours during Fall 2007.
- For the Full-Time, First-Time Transfers, during Fall 2007, approximately three percent (3.3%) had not declared a major and some of the most popular majors for transfers to Coastal Carolina included: Management (11.1%), Marketing (8.0%), Marine Science (7.2%), Psychology (6.4%), Biology (5.6%), Elementary Education (5.6%), Resort Tourism Management (5.4%), and Recreation Sport Management (5.2%).

ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book, 2007

Undergraduate Major by Class

In Fall 2007, there were 7,070 undergraduates, of whom 32% were freshman, 24% were sophomores, 19% were juniors, 22% were seniors, and 3% were non-degree seeking students.

Enrollment By Major

Undergraduate: There was a 36% increase in undergraduate students at Coastal Carolina University between Fall 2002 and Fall 2007. Specific enrollment highlights by academic college at Coastal Carolina are as follows:

- Wall College of Business Administration: 62% increase between Fall 2002 and Fall 2007 – part of this increase is due to majors in new programs such as Economics and Resort Tourism Management.
- Spandoni College of Education: 56% increase between Fall 2002 and Fall 2007 – part of this increase is due to majors in new programs such as Middle Grades Education, Recreation and Sports Management, and Special Education.
- Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts: 79% increase between Fall 2002 and Fall 2007 – part of this increase is due to majors in new programs such as Communication, and Philosophy.
- College of Natural and Applied Sciences: 15% increase between Fall 2002 and Fall 2007, which can be attributed, in part, to the new program in Physics.

Graduate: There was an 86.6% increase in the number of degree seeking graduate students at Coastal Carolina University between Fall 2003 and Fall 2007.

Average Size of Lecture Classes

In Fall 2007, the average size of lower- and upper-division lecture classes for the University was 29.8 and 22.1 respectfully. The average size of upper-division classes remain consistent while the lower-level size decreased by two when compared to the previous year, Fall 2006. This decrease can be attributed to the slight drop in undergraduate enrollment that was noticed between Fall 2006 and Fall 2007.

Total Degrees Awarded

In 2006-2007, 1079 degrees were awarded, an increase of 30% over 2002-2003. Since 1974, Coastal Carolina University has awarded nearly 16,000 degrees ranging from the associate to master levels.


