Enrollment - Fall 2008

- Total enrollment was 8,154. This is an increase of 282 (4%) from the previous fall semester. Fall 2008 FTE increased to 7,610 during the same period. This period saw the second largest number of enrolled students at Coastal Carolina University since fall 2003.
- Total undergraduate enrollment was 7,573, which is an increase of 503 (7%) students from the previous fall semester and the largest undergraduate enrollment since fall 2003.
- Undergraduate degree and non-degree-seeking students made up 93% of total fall 2008 enrollment, while 7% of the total fall 2008 enrollment was graduate degree and non-degree-seeking students. The number of degree-seeking students has gradually increased since fall 2003.
- Since 1995, the number of students attending May, Summer I, and Summer II semesters has grown from 2,109 to 3,121. In the same period the number of hours taken increased from 7,809 in 1995 to 11,957 in 2008. This growth represents a slight increase in the number of hours taken per student.

<u>Demographics – Fall 2008</u>

- Women made up 53% of the total undergraduate enrollment and 74% of total graduate enrollment for fall 2008.
- In fall 2008, 901% of total undergraduate students were enrolled full-time.
- Fifty-four (54%) of total students enrolled are from the state of South Carolina, with the remaining students from out-of-state or international origins. The most numerous out-of-state students enrolled at Coastal Carolina University are from the states of New Jersey (7%), New York (6%), and Maryland (6%). International student enrollment accounted for 85 students (1%) with a majority from Germany (0.2%).
- In fall 2008, students enrolled at Coastal Carolina University from all counties in South Carolina. Students from Horry County represented the largest number of enrollees at 2,042 (43%) followed by Georgetown (7%) Richland (6%) and Lexington (5%) counties.
- The most prominent ethnic group represented at Coastal Carolina University was White/non-Hispanic with 82% of the total fall 2008 enrolled students. The second largest ethnic group was Black/African American with 13% of the total fall 2008 enrollment.





FIRST-TIME STUDENTS

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FIRST-TIME STUDENTS HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book. 2008

Enrollment and academic trends for first-time students show the following:

- In 2008, 36% of new freshmen and transfer students attended Summer Orientation sessions. Thirty-eight (38%) of accepted students who attended these sessions enrolled at Coastal Carolina University.
- Applications from new undergraduate students increased by 41% between fall 2004 and fall 2008. New students who were accepted to the University increased by 33% between fall 2004 and fall 2008. New students who enrolled increased by 11% between fall 2004 and fall 2008. In fall 2008, 38% of accepted applicants enrolled at Coastal Carolina University.
- Between fall 2004 and fall 2008, the average SAT score among Coastal Carolina
 University freshmen (1030) decreased by 11 points yet still exceeded the average
 scores for high school students in South Carolina (985) and the nation (1017). The
 average ACT composite score for Coastal Carolina University freshmen (22) was on
 par with that of the nation (21) and two points higher than the state-wide average
 (20) for the fall 2008 cohort. (The writing test is not included in total SAT scores)
- The average high school GPA for Coastal Carolina University freshmen increased from 3.29 for the fall 2004 cohort to 3.35 for the fall 2008 cohort. The fall 2008 cohort GPA is slightly higher (3.32) than the previously admitted fall 2007.
- The freshman profile for the fall 2004 through fall 2008 cohorts indicates that the number of first-time students that apply, are accepted, and enroll at Coastal Carolina University, in most cases, continued to grow. In fall 2008 there were 1,655 new freshmen which shows an increase of .2% from fall 2007.
- There were a total of 1,649 first-time full-time freshmen students enrolled at Coastal Carolina University between fall 2007 and fall 2008. Among first-time full-time students during this period there were approximately 1,178 (71%) students continuing their studies at Coastal Carolina University. In geographic origin, 545 (46%) of continuing students were native to South Carolina and 633 (54%) consisted of students from other U.S. states and international students. Among the academic colleges, the continuation of full-time first-time students for this period is as follows: Wall College of Business Administration (73%), Spadoni College of Education (77%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (72%), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences (70%) and undeclared majors (65%).


<u>Demographics - First-Time Full-Time Freshmen - Fall 2009</u>

- The most prominent ethnic group among the fall 2008 first-time full-time freshmen was White/Non-Hispanic (80%). Black/African Americans consisted of 15% and Hispanics encompassed 2% of this group.
- Females slightly outnumbered males in the fall 2008 full-time first-time freshmen group making up 51% of the total.

- In fall 2008 first-time full-time freshmen consisted mostly of students under the age of 20 at 98%.
- Eighteen percent (18%) of the in-state first-time full-time freshmen at Coastal Carolina University originated from the immediate five-county service area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately 27% originated from other South Carolina counties.
- Approximately 68% of first-time full-time freshmen during fall 2008 reported high school grade point averages (GPA) equal or exceeding 3.00. Thirty-seven percent (37%) indicated a high school GPA that fell between 3.00 and 3.49, while 32% reported a GPA of 3.50 or higher.
- For the full-time first-time freshmen during fall 2008 approximately 15% had not declared a major. The most popular undergraduate majors at Coastal Carolina University among first-time freshmen included: Marine Science (13%), Management (11%), Biology (10%) and Marketing (5%).

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FIRST-TIME TRANSFER STUDENTS HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book. 2008

Enrollment and academic trends of first-time transfer students show the following:

- The number of students (658) who transferred to Coastal Carolina University in 2007 increased by 7% over 2006. Transfer students who came to Coastal Carolina University from other South Carolina higher education institutions comprised approximately 42% of the total transfer student population in 2007. The majority of these in-state transfer students, approximately 54%, were previously enrolled at Horry-Georgetown Technical College.
- The first year student retention rate for 2007 transfer students was 81%, a decrease of 9% over the 2006 rate.
- There were a total of 611 first-time full-time transfer students enrolled at Coastal Carolina University between fall 2007 and fall 2008. Among this group there were approximately 459 (75%) students continuing their studies at Coastal Carolina University. In geographic origin, 243 (53%) of continuing students were native to South Carolina and 216 (47%) consisted of students from other U.S. states or countries. Among the academic colleges the continuation of first-time full-time transfer students for this period was as follows: Wall College of Business Administration (81%), Spadoni College of Education (81%), Edwards College of Humanities (74%), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences (63%) and undeclared majors (70%).

<u>Demographics - First-Time Full-Time Transfers - Fall 2008</u>

- The most prominent ethnic group among the fall 2008 first-time full-time transfers was White/Non-Hispanic (777%) with Black/African Americans consisting of 14% and Hispanics encompassing 3% of this group.
- The number of males and female first-time full-time transfers to Coastal Carolina University were nearly equal with females (52%) slightly outnumbering males (48%).
- First-time full-time transfers during this period consisted mostly of students between the ages of 20 and 22 (58%). An additional 23% consisted of students less than 20 years of age.
- Among the full-time first-time transfers during fall 2008 there were more in-state students enrolled (50%) than out-of-state (47%) and international (3%) students.

- In fall 2008 approximately 31% of the in-state first-time full-time transfer students at Coastal Carolina University originated from the immediate five-county service area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties.
 Approximately 19% originated from other South Carolina counties.
- Of the 669 first-time full-time transfers to Coastal Carolina University in fall 2008, 69% transferred more than thirty credit hours, 3% transferred with 30 hours, and 28% transferred with less than 30 hours.
- For the full-time first-time transfers during fall 2008 approximately three percent (3%) had not declared a major. The most popular majors for transfers to Coastal Carolina University included: Management (12%), Psychology (7%), Biology (7%), Marine Science (6%) and Marketing (5%).

Undergraduate Major by Class

In fall 2008 there were 7,573 undergraduates, of whom 30% were freshmen, 24% sophomores, 20% juniors, 23% seniors, and 3% non-degree seeking students.

Enrollment By Major

Undergraduate: There was a 35% increase in undergraduate student enrollment at Coastal Carolina University between fall 2003 and fall 2008. Specific enrollment highlights by academic college are as follows:

- Wall College of Business Administration: 47% increase between fall 2003 and fall 2008. This increase may be attributed to two majors in new programs such as Economics and Resort Tourism Management.
- Spadoni College of Education: 65% increase between fall 2003 and fall 2008. This
 increase may be due to majors in new programs such as Middle Level Education and
 Recreation and Sports Management. The Middle Level Education major grew in
 enrollment 417% over the five year period.
- Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts: 48% increase between fall 2003 and fall 2008. This increase may be due to the new major in Communication. The Musical Theatre major grew in enrollment 74% over the five year period.
- College of Natural and Applied Sciences: 13% increase between fall 2003 and fall 2008. This increase may be attributed, in part, to the new program in Physics. The Biology and Chemistry majors continue to grow as well with increases in enrollment over the five year period at 48% and 42% respectively.

Graduate: There was an 84% increase in the number of degree-seeking graduate students at Coastal Carolina University between fall 2003 and fall 2008.

Average Size of Lecture Classes

In fall 2008 the average size of lower- and upper-division lecture classes for the University was 27.9 and 23.6 respectfully.

Student/Faculty Ratios

The student/faculty has decreased by 10% between fall 2005 (19.4:1) and fall 2008 (17.5:1). Coastal Carolina University places great emphasis on high quality teaching and faculty as mentors. These goals can be realized, in part, through smaller classes and student/faculty ratios.

Total Degrees Awarded

In 2007-2008, 1,162 degrees were awarded; an increase of 46% over 2003-2004. Since 1974 Coastal Carolina University has awarded nearly 17,000 degrees ranging from the associate to master levels. The Wall College of Business awarded the highest number of degrees (4,648) between 1974 and 2008.





Faculty Profile

In fall 2008 there were 323 full-time employees with faculty rank, which is an increase of 14% from 2007. Of the full-time faculty, 42% were women and 58% men.

Of full-time employees with faculty rank, 79% possessed terminal degrees and 54% were tenured. Of this same group: 20% were professors, 22% associate professors, 37% assistant professors, and 21% instructors/other. Approximately, 65% of FTE students were taught by full-time faculty.

Full-Time Faculty by College and Rank

In fall 2008 each college had at or more than 75% of their full-time teaching staff holding a rank of Assistant Professor or higher. The breakdown for each college is as follows: Wall College of Business (85%), Spadoni College of Education (90%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (73%), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences (76%), and the Kimbel Library (100%).






S.C. PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES Undergraduate Tuition, 2008-2009
