The Spring 2021 semester will require continued vigilance to keep each other safe. Here are some reminders about quarantine, isolation, testing, and reporting on campus. Remember to keep wearing your masks and maintain physical distancing.



Quarantine is used to keep someone who might've been exposed to COVID-19 away from others. Quarantine helps prevents the spread of the disease that can occur before a person knows that they are sick or if they are infected with the virus without feeling the symptoms.

Free COVID-19 viral testing is provided seven days a week throughout January

Timing of test results vary but are generally available within 3 to 4 days.

For students who test positive, it is very important that you notify the University by sending an email to covid@coastal.edu

For faculty and staff who test positive, please notify CCU by completing the COVLD-19 intake report for the Office of Human Resources Isolation is used to prevent those who are infected with the virus (those who are sick with COVID-19 and those with no symptoms but have tested positive) from people who are not infected.
