Enrolled, degree-seeking students at Coastal Carolina University can earn college credit for knowledge gained outside the classroom. The College Level Examination Program (CLEP) is a system of credit by examination sponsored by the College Board. The examinations are developed by college faculty nationwide and reflect material usually covered during basic or introductory coursework. The tests are fair but demanding. Through this program, degree candidates at Coastal Carolina University may attempt a CLEP test on subjects listed within this brochure. A satisfactory score will give the student credit equal to the comparable college course. Some examinations may not be accepted for required or elective courses. Students should check with the adviser in their major.

Please read the following information before scheduling a CLEP examination:

- Students must be currently enrolled in classes at Coastal Carolina University.
- The student must obtain written consent from the dean of his/her major.
- CLEP credit will not be allowed for courses in which you are enrolled at other institutions or at Coastal Carolina University, even if the course did not transfer or even if you did not complete the course and/or received a grade of "W."
- CLEP credit may not be used to earn credit for previously enrolled, failed or audited courses.
- CLEP scores are not calculated into student's GPA; students receive credit hours only.
- CLEP credit will not be awarded if students are on suspension (academic or nonacademic) from the University.
- Students may not repeat CLEP examinations for Coastal Carolina University credit.
- Students may not take the CLEP test for a foreign language if the language is their native language.
- CLEP scores do not transfer to other institutions unless the student requests an official transcript from CLEP (for a fee) by visiting clep.collegeboard.org or calling 800-257-9558. Acceptance is up to the individual university.

Subject examinations are administered at Coastal Carolina University. General CLEP exams are not offered and are not accepted for credit. Each examination is in the multiple-choice format and is 90 minutes in duration.

Coastal Carolina University reserves the right to change test requirements, criteria for course exemptions, number of credits awarded and fees when warranted. Every effort will be made to minimize the inconvenience such changes may create for students.

Student scores are provided onscreen immediately upon completion of an exam.

SCORE REPORTS

Students who want to send scores to a college, employer or certifying agency are given the opportunity to select this option in the examination software on the day of the exam. This service is free of charge only if the student selects score recipients at the time of testing. After initial testing, official CLEP transcripts (which are kept by CLEP for 20 years) can be obtained for a fee by visiting clep.collegeboard.org or by calling 800-257-9558.
