### Grade point summary for student athletes, 2012-13

- 51.7% of student-athletes posted a GPA between 3.0-4.0.
- 9 women's sports programs have team cumulative GPAs above 3.0.
- 4 men's sports programs (golf, cross country, tennis and soccer) have team cumulative GPAs over 3.0.

### NCAA Division I academic reform

- Graduation Success Rate (GSR) =
  - Freshmen + transfers - students leaving with academic eligibility
  
- Academic Progress Rate (APR) =
  - Total points earned by team (SA with institutional financial aid) / total points possible
    - Points earned for retention and academic eligibility.
    - Four-year average for multi year rate

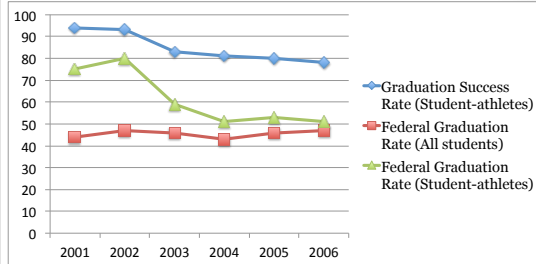

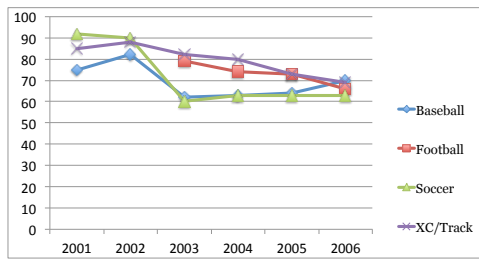

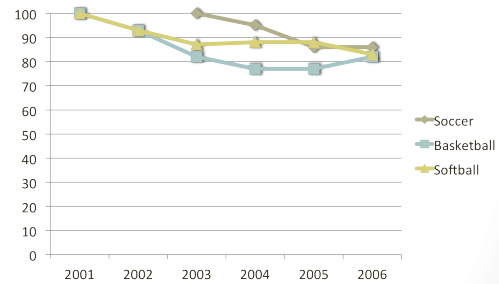
**Graduation Success rate trends, 2001-06 cohorts**

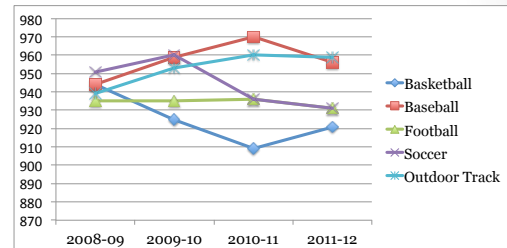
