#### **Easing the Process for Transfer Students**

### Transfer Students with an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Bachelor of Arts, or Bachelor of Science

Transfer students accepted to Coastal Carolina University with an earned Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Bachelor of Arts, or Bachelor of Science from a regionally accredited institution will have all Core Curriculum requirements waived. Transfer credits earned by the student may be applied to foundation, minor, cognate, or major requirements, or will be counted as electives. Course prerequisites and minimum credit requirements for the awarding of degrees will still apply.

#### **Online Resources for Transfer Students**

Students interested in transferring to Coastal Carolina University or taking classes during the summer session may now access two websites for transfer information. These websites offer students the ability to:

- Locate information related to transfer requirements (including application deadlines), the transfer of credits, and contact information for institutional transfer officers.
- · Access transfer agreements that exist for the institution.
- Search for course equivalencies to determine how courses taken at one institution will transfer to Coastal Carolina University.

The first portal, **collegetransfer.net**, is a national portal and contains information for institutions across the United States. The second portal, **sctrac.org**, is designed specifically for South Carolina-based students. Both sites contain information on transferable courses and transfer agreements as well as acceptable CLEP, AP, and IB credits. The data contained on both sites is continually updated as new equivalencies are determined.

For an equivalency database managed by CCU, go to webadvisor.coastal.edu, click on "Applicants," then click on "View Transfer Course Equivs." You will need your prior institutions CEEB code, which can be found at www.collegeboard.org. This course equivalency list is updated daily when official transcripts are received and reviewed; it is not a complete listing of all transferable courses from each institution, and is subject to change without notification.

#### The Transfer Student and Admission

An applicant is considered a transfer student when they have attended another regionally accredited post-secondary institution in any capacity after completing high school. To be considered for admission, the transfer applicant should have earned a minimum cumulative collegiate 2.0 GPA or a C average in at least two full-time semesters of course work (24 transferable credits) or the equivalent from all regionally accredited colleges/universities attended.\* Cumulative collegiate GPA will be based on transcripts and will not be recalculated.

Transfer applicants who have earned fewer than 24 transferable credits or the equivalent must meet both transfer and freshman admission requirements, including submitting final official high school transcripts and official standardized test scores (SAT or ACT). It takes about 2-3 weeks for Coastal to receive your scores. Applicants age 22 or older are not required to submit SAT or ACT scores. SAT scores must be sent directly from the College Board. You can request them online at www.collegeboard.org. Coastal Carolina University's code to request the scores is 5837. ACT scores can be sent directly from ACT. You can request scores online at www.act.org. Coastal Carolina University's code to receive the scores is 3843. (See the Coastal Carolina University Catalog or visit coastal.edu/admissions/freshman for complete freshman admission information.) For admission to Coastal Carolina University from another institution, a transfer student must:

- Complete an application for admission and submit a nonrefundable application fee.
- Provide official copies of transcripts from all previously attended institutions directly to the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards.
- Be academically eligible to return to the last institution attended as a degree candidate (i.e., not on academic or disciplinary suspension).

You must submit all required documentation before we can review your application for admission to the University.

\*Transfer students who have earned an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science from a South Carolina Technical College will be academically guaranteed admission provided that they satisfy the nonacademic admissions review portion of the admissions application. An Associate in Applied Science and degrees from foreign institutions are not eligible for academic guaranteed admissions.

#### **Transfer Policy**

Coastal Carolina University has adopted the following policy for determining transfer of academic credits from regionally accredited institutions:

- A student transferring to Coastal Carolina University will submit all official transcripts to the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards for evaluation.
- Up to 76 transferable credits of college parallel courses may be accepted from a regionally accredited two-year college transfer program to be applicable toward a Coastal Carolina University degree.
- Up to 90 transferable credits of college parallel courses may be accepted from regionally accredited four-year colleges or universities to be applicable toward a Coastal Carolina University degree.
- 4. A maximum of 30 credit hours may be applied toward a bachelor's degree from the combined sources of military credit and correspondence credit.
- 5. A minimum grade of C (e.g., C-, C, or C+) in a course is required for transfer credit to be awarded for that course. Coursework completed on a pass/fail grading scale will only be considered for credit if the course is academic in nature and the institution's transcript key defines a pass as equivalent to a minimum grade of C.
- 6. Students cannot receive credit for a course taken at Coastal Carolina University if they have received transfer credit for an equivalent course taken previously at another institution. Transferred courses may be used to satisfy degree requirements subject to program approval. A student can never be awarded more transfer credit for a course than the original institution awarded.
- Courses taken at another institution while under academic suspension may transfer to Coastal Carolina University in accordance with University transfer policies.
- Academic coursework taken elsewhere two-year schools, international credit, nonregionally accredited institutions, Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) – must be handled in the following ways:
  - Two-year schools: Certain degree programs do not recognize transfer credit from a two-year institution for courses which are considered upper-division or upper-level (300-400) courses at Coastal Carolina University.
  - b. Applicants who have attended post-secondary educational institutions, colleges, or universities outside the United States are required to submit a professional credential evaluation of all postsecondary work completed including a course-by-course report, GPA calculation, and copies of original transcripts verified by a credential evaluation service by an organization that is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education to conduct foreign credential evaluation and that is a member of NACES or AICE. These reports should be sent directly to International Recruitment and Admissions in the Office of Global Engagement at Coastal Carolina University. Detailed course descriptions from foreign colleges/universities must also be sent in English.

- Courses are evaluated in consultation with the dean of the college of the student's major and with the dean of each course in review.
- c. Transfer applicants with advanced standing from colleges and universities not accredited by a regional accrediting association must validate, by examination, all credits presented for transfer. A detailed explanation of validation procedures may be found in the Credit by Examination section of the University catalog or may be obtained from the Registrar (catalog.coastal.edu).
- d. Business-related transfer credits will be awarded as departmental electives for upper-division or upper-level coursework from a regionally accredited fouryear university or college that is not accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB).
- Repeated coursework, including repeat forgiveness for individual courses or academic forgiveness/bankruptcy, will be evaluated based on the policy of the applicant's prior or home institution.
- All courses completed at a regionally accredited institution will be evaluated for transfer, regardless of the applicant's academic standing at the applicant's prior or home institution.
- 11. Coursework with nonstandard grades (withdrawal, withdrawal failing, repeated course, etc.) will be evaluated based on the transcript key and institutional policy of the applicant's prior or home institution.

#### **Transcript Evaluation**

The Office of Admissions and Merit Awards will complete an initial evaluation of transcripts to identify courses that can transfer for credit to Coastal Carolina University. An official list of those transferable credits is then mailed to each accepted transfer student. Refer to the list of approved courses for transfer in this guide.

The department chair or academic advisor evaluates specific courses, as needed, and determines which course credits apply to that particular major.

For additional information on transcript evaluation, call the Office of Admissions and Merit Awards at 843-349-2170. If a student later decides to change his/her major, a re-evaluation of applicable credits must be completed by the department chair of the new major.

As a general rule, credits earned in courses that apply to one or more of the following categories are usually not acceptable for transfer credit:

- Courses that are occupational or technical in nature.
- Courses that are essentially remedial.
- Courses not recognized in that institution's catalog as part of its college parallel transfer program.

Exceptions to the above categories may be made only by the dean or designee of the college in which the student plans to enroll (major), by the dean or designee of the college that offers the course, or by the Interdisciplinary Studies Committee in specific cases where such courses are judged to be uniquely relevant to the student's degree program. Certain degree programs do not recognize some transfer credits from two-year institutions for courses that are considered upper-division or upper-level courses at Coastal Carolina University. However, some degree programs will grant transfer credit for such courses as lower-level electives or Core Curriculum requirements. Each transfer student should discuss the transfer of academic credits not listed in this guide with the academic advisor assigned by the dean of the student's major. Students should be aware that changing majors while at Coastal Carolina University will require a reevaluation and approval of the transfer credits for application to the new majors.

#### **Calculation of Coastal Carolina University Grade Point Average**

Coastal Carolina University accepts the credit only for transfer, not the *grade* for grade point average (GPA) calculation. (A student's GPA is calculated on Coastal Carolina University courses only.)

The GPA is calculated on the basis of all work in the student's career **at Coastal Carolina University**. All credits earned at other institutions and transferred to Coastal Carolina University may be used to satisfy program requirements but will not be calculated as a part of the GPA.

#### **In-Residence Coursework Requirements**

Regardless of the point in the student's academic career in which the student enters the University, in order to be eligible to receive a degree from Coastal Carolina University, a student must earn a minimum of 25 percent of the degree program's requirements "in residence" at the University, including 12 credit hours of the student's major courses and six credit hours of minor courses offered by Coastal (see "in residence" under the Graduation section of the University catalog). Some programs impose higher student residence and/or major requirements.

Students are responsible for their individual academic programs and for meeting the requirements of their major department and the University.

#### Core Curriculum (38 to 40 credits)

The purpose of the Core Curriculum is to provide an educational experience in the liberal arts tradition that promotes inquiry, creativity, and critical thinking.

The Core Curriculum provides opportunities for students to develop skills in the following: critical thinking and reasoning, written and oral communication, and quantitative and information literacy.

The complete list of Core Curriculum courses (effective Fall 2021-2022) is also located in the Undergraduate Catalog. These courses can change without notice. Please visit the University catalog for the updated course list and a full explanation of the Core Curriculum: catalog.coastal.edu.

#### Admission to the Wall College of Business Administration

A student begins in the Wall College of Business as a pre-major. To be fully admitted and eligible to take 300- and 400-level classes, the student must fulfill the requirements listed below:

- 1. Have a minimum cumulative collegiate GPA of 2.25 after 45 earned credit hours.
- 2. Have a grade of C or better in the following courses: CBAD 120, ENGL 101, CBAD 201, ECON 201 or ECON 202, and one of the following CSCI 110, CSCI 120, CSCI 135, DCD 102, DCD 201, or GEOG 204. For accounting, finance, and economics majors, a grade of C or better is required in MATH 132 or MATH 160. For management, marketing, and hospitality majors, a grade of C or better is required in one of the following: MATH 138, MATH 132, or MATH 160.
- Complete a formal application for admission into the Wall College of Business and submit it to their academic advisor. Incoming transfer students with more than 45 credit hours will be automatically evaluated for admission into the Wall College of Business.

Transfer credit for 300- or 400-level business courses will be accepted, for degree requirements, only from AACSB accredited business programs. Exceptions to this policy must be approved through the dean's office with consultation, as appropriate, with department heads. Transfer students will be required to take, at CCU, a minimum of 24 credit hours of 300- and 400-level courses from the Wall College of Business foundation, core, and major requirements. The 24 credit hours must include CBAD 478.

## Admission to the Spadoni College of Education and Social Sciences (2021-2022)

A student begins in the Spadoni College of Education and Social Sciences as a pre-major. During the first two years of study (approximately 60 semester credit hours) students will be advised by their professional adviser and must complete the prescribed introductory courses for their respective programs which will include but not be limited to: EDUC 111; EDUC 204; EDUC 215; ENGL 101, ENGL 102, and the majority of their Core Curriculum coursework in addition to specific major requirements. In addition, all pre-professional program education majors will be required to take and pass the PRAXIS I exam or qualify for exemption and at the conclusion of 60 hours of instruction, apply for admission to the Professional Program

in Teacher Education. Candidates may complete a formal application for admission to the professional program in teacher education (PPTE) when they have completed at least 60 hours of college level coursework and have met the following requirements for Portal I:

- Complete PPTE application. All requirements on the current application to the professional program must be met before admission. The following evidence is required and reviewed before admission to the professional program in teacher education:
  - Complete 60 hours of undergraduate coursework, which includes all education requirements and program specific requirements.
  - o Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
  - o Pass or exempt the Core Academic Skills Praxis I Exam.
- Passing scores on all three areas of Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators Test: reading (156), writing (158), and math (142). The following scores are also permitted.
  - o Score of 1100 or higher on SAT (as of March 2016).
  - 550 score or higher on math exempts Praxis Core Academic Skills test of mathematics.
  - 550 score or higher on evidence-based reading and writing exempts Praxis
     Core Academic Skills test of reading and writing.
  - SAT taken prior to March 2016: SAT composite score of 1650 (math, reading, and writing) or higher.
  - ACT Composite score of 22 or higher exempts full Praxis Core Academic Skills test.
  - English score of 22 or higher exempts Praxis Core Academic Skills test of reading and writing.
  - Mathematics score of 22 or higher exempts Praxis Core Academic Skills test of mathematics.
- Complete a South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) background check.
- Submit a professional reference.
- Early childhood candidates must submit a cleared TB test.

#### **Pre-Professional Education Program Candidate Classes by Program Areas**

All students striving to enter the professional program MUST complete the following: ENGL 101, ENGL 102, EDUC 111, EDUC 204, EDUC 215, and earn a grade of C or better in all of their foundation courses.

Furthermore, students need to meet the following additional program-specific requirements:

**Early Childhood:** EDUC 276; MATH 201; MATH 202; two sciences with lab, and foreign language.

**Elementary Education:** MATH 201; MATH 202; one science, and one foreign language.

Middle Level Education: EDML 317; EDUC 334; EDUC 335, MSCI 102/MSCI 102L.

**Physical Education:** EDPE 290 and EXSS 122. Choose one personal fitness course (PALS 102-124), two lifetime sport courses (PALS 125-149), and two lifetime activity courses (PALS 150-180).

Special Education: EDSP 200; EDUC 336; MATH 201; MATH 202; and foreign language.

#### **Admission to the Marine Science Degree Program**

#### **Transfer Students**

Prior to being admitted to the Department of Marine Science as a degree candidate, a transfer student must meet the general admissions requirements and complete one of the following:

 A score of 510 or higher on the SAT math subtest for SAT exams taken in March 2016 and later, or a math subtest minimum score of 470 or higher on SAT exams taken prior to March 2016, or a score of 20 or higher on the math subtest of the ACT exam. Students may retake the SAT or ACT and submit new scores for consideration.

OR

Completion of College Algebra or a higher-level college math course with a grade of at least C from a regionally accredited college or university.

Students who meet general admissions requirements, but do not satisfy requirements for admission as a degree-seeking marine science major will be admitted as a marine science pre-major.

#### Admission to the Intelligence and National Security Studies Program

Prior to being admitted to the Department of Intelligence and Security Studies as an intelligence and national security studies degree candidate, a transfer student must meet the general admissions requirements and must meet one of the following requirements:

- A score of 1040 or higher on the SAT (exams taken prior to March 2016) or 1120 or higher (exams taken after March 2016), or a score of 22 or higher on the ACT exam;

  AND
  - 2. A minimum cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 or higher.

OR

 Complete INTEL 200 with a grade of B or better from a regionally accredited college or university.

Students who do not earn a grade of B or better may repeat INTEL 200 only one time.

Students who meet general admissions requirements, but do not satisfy requirements for admission as a degree-seeking intelligence and national security studies major, will be admitted as an intelligence and national security studies pre-major.

#### Auditions Required for Music (B.A.) and Theatre (B.F.A.) Programs

Transfer students must meet the general admissions requirements and audition for full admittance to these majors. For more information on auditions, see **coastal.edu/music/audition** or **coastal.edu/theatre/audition**.

#### **PGA Golf Management Program**

To be admitted to the PGA Golf Management program, a transfer student must meet the general admissions requirements of the University, choose a major within the Wall College of Business Administration and submit the following documentation to CCU's PGA Golf Management program:

- · Application to the PGA Golf program.
- Verification of a handicap of 12 or less
- Letter of Recommendation from a PGA member

These forms will be provided to the student with the general admission letter.

#### Health Administration, B.S. (Completion Program)

To be admitted to the major, transfer students must meet the general admissions requirements and:

 Have an associate degree from a regionally accredited institution and a certification or license in a health science area.

OR

Have earned an associate of art, associate of science, Bachelor of Arts, or Bachelor
of Science degree from a regionally accredited institution.

#### Nursing, B.S.N. (Completion Program)

To be admitted to the major, transfer students must meet the general admissions requirements, and must have graduated from an accredited nursing program with a grade of C or better in all nursing courses, and have an active license as a registered nurse (RN) in South Carolina or live in a Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) state with multistate privileges.
