COURSE DESCRIPTION

ARTS 312 Intermediate Painting II: Abstraction. (3 credits) (Prereq: ARTS 211 or ARTS 212 or Permission of Instructor) Further explorations into traditional and non-traditional materials and techniques of painting with an emphasis on the concepts, applications, and history of abstraction in painting leading to individual expression, and concept. S.

COURSE INSTRUCTIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Experience a variety of traditional and non-traditional methods of abstract painting skills and techniques.
- Demonstrate a variety of abstract painting approaches through objective and nonobjective subject matter.
- Engage in critical analysis of paintings connecting the components of subject and content as they relate to abstract painting.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Students paint with the various approaches and alternate techniques of abstract painting.
- Students paint original paintings using the subject matter of still life, figure, and nonobjective/expressive elements.
- Students are familiar with modern and contemporary abstract painters
- Students practice positive health and safety behaviors when using opaque paints and solvents.
- Students participate in critique sessions using professional terminology and critical thinking skills.
