COURSE DESCRIPTION

(0-1) Study, rehearsal, and performance of chamber music for woodwind instruments. May be repeated; students should check with their major department regarding applicable degree credit. **May be taken for 0-1 credit hours.**

OBJECTIVES

Students will:

Increase knowledge of chamber music repertoire for woodwind instruments
Develop rehearsal and practice skills

Develop collaborative skills (blend, balance, breath)

Develop active listening skills

Perform for a public audience

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

Students will be able to:

Apply previously learned skills to ensemble setting

Apply stylistic consideration to various genres and composers as appropriate
Demonstrate professionalism and collegiality in rehearsal

Describe complex tuning relationships between instruments

REQUIRED MATERIALS

ATTENDANCE

Face Coverings

We know from existing data that wearing a mask in public can help prevent the spread of SARS-CoV-2, which causes COVID-19, in the community (Lyu & Wehby, 2020; CDC, 2020; Johns Hopkins Medicine, 2020).
