State the nature of change and provide a summary of the rationale for and objectives of the program. Include the number of credit hours the change entails.

In a partnership with SC CREATE and Horry-Georgetown Technical College, the special education program in the Spadoni College of Education and Social Sciences is offering a BA degree to instructional aides, pararaprofessionals in the state of South Carolina. We would like to offer program coursework via 100% online delivery. Like many states across the nation, South Carolina is facing a shortage of highly qualified educators. According to CERRA, there were 5987 departures in 2020. As of February 2021, there were 677 additional departures. There were over 515 vacant positions across the state. There are fewer qualified applicants for each position than in previous years. Most of these vacant positions are at the secondary level. Many local schools are full of capable support personnel who are dedicated to their schools and communities. Each semester, we receive numerous calls from support personnel who desire to continue their education but are unable to leave their current position and lose their salaries and benefits. They desire affordable, convenient opportunities to pursue degrees in education. The purpose of our initiative is to collaborate with local school districts to offer a "grow your own" model. Initiatives such as these are successful in recruiting and retaining educators for their districts. This project will also supply local districts with personnel who are committed to their community and the schools in which they serve. This change will impact the required 60 credits in the special education program coursework. They will take this coursework online without interruption to their full-time work schedules in the schools.

Coastal Carolina provide exceptional IT support for our current online programs. Currently, the special education master's program and additional licensure coursework is offered in an online format. Students are able to successfully access our learning platform (Moodle), use library resources, and maintain communication with all course professors via email and Zoom. They have IT support offered by the university consistently. We do not anticipate any changes being required to move the course content online for this BA in special education.
