

## Honors College Curriculum Timeline

### *Information for Students and Faculty Advisors*

Completion of the curricular requirements for Honors should not be too difficult for students, as long as the required courses are not left until the final couple of semesters. The following schedules are examples of how to complete the Honors requirements in a **normal 8-semester curriculum**, and in the **6-semester curriculum of a degree-in-three student**.

#### An example 8-semester student schedule:

<b>Semester</b>	<b>Honors Courses</b>	<b>Other Notes</b>
<i>1<sup>st</sup> Year Fall</i>	<b>Honors-only Course (3 credits)</b> ex: HONR 105 – counts in Core	
<i>1<sup>st</sup> Year Spring</i>	<b>Honors-only Course (3 credits)</b> ex: HONR 201 – counts in Core	
<i>2<sup>nd</sup> Year Fall</i>	<b>Honors section in major (3 credits)</b>	
<i>2<sup>nd</sup> Year Spring</i>	<b>Honors-only 300 Course (3 credits)</b> ex: HONR 305 – counts in Core	
<i>3<sup>rd</sup> Year Fall</i>	<b>Honors section in major (3 credits)</b>	Talk to faculty members about mentoring you in a thesis. Check your department's requirements for theses or capstones.
<i>3<sup>rd</sup> Year Spring</i>	<b>Honors section in major (3 credits)</b>	
<i>4<sup>th</sup> Year Fall</i>	<b>Honors section in major (3 credits)</b> (or prep course for majors' capstone)	Apply for graduation. Register for your Honors Thesis course.
<i>4<sup>th</sup> Year Spring</i>	<b>Honors Thesis Course (3 credits)</b> (usually major capstone)	Your advisor submits your completed thesis before graduation.

#### Notes:

- This is only one example; you may certainly take these courses in a different order!
- This shows only the minimum requirements; you may also take as many honors courses as you want!

**An example 6-semester student schedule:**

*for students doing degree-in-three*

<b>Semester</b>	<b>Honors Courses</b>	<b>Other Notes</b>
<i>1<sup>st</sup> Year Fall</i>	<b>Honors-only Course (3 credits)</b> ex: HONR 105 – counts in Core	
<i>1<sup>st</sup> Year Spring</i>	<b>Honors-only Course (3 credits)</b> ex: HONR 201 – counts in Core <b>Honors section in major (3 credits)</b>	
<i>2<sup>nd</sup> Year Fall</i>	<b>Honors section in major (3 credits)</b>	Talk to faculty members about mentoring you in a thesis. Check your department’s requirements for theses or capstones.
<i>2<sup>nd</sup> Year Spring</i>	<b>Honors-only 300 Course (3 credits)</b> ex: HONR 305 – counts in Core <b>Honors section in major (3 credits)</b>	
<i>3<sup>rd</sup> Year Fall</i>	<b>Honors section in major (3 credits)</b> (or prep course for majors’ capstone)	Apply for graduation. Register for your Honors Thesis course.
<i>3<sup>rd</sup> Year Spring</i>	<b>Honors Thesis Course (3 credits)</b> (usually major capstone)	Your advisor submits your completed thesis before graduation.
